Relay for Life/Cancer Society Fundraiser:

In two weeks time Whaea Katie will be attending Relay for Life where she and her team will walk around a track for 17 hours. Whaea Katie and her team have managed to fundraise \$2940 towards the cause and hopes to boost it up even higher, closer to the event.

With free access to important resources including specialist advice and information, transport to treatment, and accommodation when undergoing treatment far from home, the Cancer Society ensures that none of them have to go through cancer alone. Your support helps to fund cancer prevention policy and life-saving cancer research, and to provide support and hope to cancer patients and their whānau from diagnosis through to post-treatment.




Kōtare Class Focus:

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
